"Growing Spiritually as Individuals and as a Church"

Today's religious beliefs and worship practices have become a buffet, with believers picking and choosing from a rich variety of choices. Some choices aren't as filling and healthy as others. On more than one occasion I've heard Christians extolling the virtues of crystal therapy, horoscopes and other things I consider to be oddities. Folk beliefs and new age ideas combine in a dubiously healthy stew on their plates. And some do continue to come to church on Sundays. I wonder how they mentally survive the maze of cobbled beliefs to find clarity, and yet there are the "healing" crystals on either side of the cross on their necklace.

As annoying as it is, so it has always been. Israelite leaders constantly complain in the Old Testament text of "foreign" worship practices seeping into Israel's worship life. They were not exaggerating. The archeological evidence is abundant. Golden calves, Ashera pole holes, and a host of other non-orthodox evidence turns up constantly in modern diggings. *Acts 8: 26-40* is the story of a foreigner trying to make sense of Isaiah's writings. Philip stops to explain the prophecies of Jesus and before you know it, this foreigner is getting baptized in some nearby water, probably a ditch by the side of the road! This annoys me more than a little. How did Philip do that? One minute he is explaining the text and the next minute he's baptizing a guy he just met. Conversions take me a lot longer. But I think I know his secret.

1 John 4:7-21, beginning and ending with love, tells believers how to live. It also tells us how to make believers of non-believers. On the good side, it can be easier than you think. On the bad side, it requires us to set our ego aside and love others before they love us first. That's a hard one. We all want to be loved and love others, but we all want to be loved first. Hardest of all, we need to love others more than we love ourselves and our possessions, and our agendas. Come to church on Sunday and find out how God makes all this easier than it looks.
