Like most people my age, I have a pill sorter. Of course, I hate it because pill sorters are one of the many bridges to old age that once crossed, allow no retreat. They are a bridge of no return. In its own way it is kind of pretty with all the brightly colored pills filling the compartments. Every morning and evening I pour the contents from one of the compartments out and swallow the bunch with water. If I do that regularly, my health is stable. But also like most people my age, I sometimes forget and then the test numbers start heading every direction. Is it age related forgetfulness, or my stubbornness insisting that I am still young and vigorous, and need no assistance to maintain myself? I suppose it's a little of both.

I think this is how most people see church attendance and God's word. Most agree that the Word is attractive and works best when we regularly follow the "Manufacturer's directions." But we find reasons to forget or avoid regular doses of prayer and biblical wisdom. When we do, our life "test numbers" start going in all sorts of directions we later recognize were not helpful or productive. Why do we do these things when we know we should regularly take our spiritual medicine to maintain a stable life? This week's readings give us a hint. *Psalm 97* reassures us that those who follow the LORD are rewarded. *Acts 16:16-35* tells an amusing story of a fortune telling slave whose divining powers are taken away by the command of Paul. The owners are unimpressed by Paul's spiritual powers because they're focused on the loss of the tidy income they were collecting on their slave's powers.

What is holding you back from fulfilling the Word in your life? Come to church this Sunday at 9:30 in person or online to hear more of God's Word. And remember to take your meds, both physical and spiritual.
