I need to get away because too many bonds in my life have been ripped away and I need time to recover. I guess the only thing worse in my mind is to never have the bonds to start.

We are all tired from a year of serving God and community and need a slow Summer to recover. Church work is hard for everyone where the good and bad experiences tend to live in our heads for long periods because, like family, our bonds have been formed over many years and the roots run all the way to the bottom of our soul.
